ABOUT THE ORIGIN This wine is handcrafted with grapes from a specially selected block called Cuartel 55, a vineyard of just 6 hectares planted on the hillsides of the Pencahue area in the Maule Valley. Characterized by their dark purple color, the colluvial soils found here inspired the name of this wine, Tierras Moradas, meaning purple earth.

HARVEST AND VINIFICATION The ripening season of the 2010 vintage was a long and perfectly balanced with lower than normal temperatures during the summer season. These conditions resulted in an increase in color and flavor intensity in the berries as well as softer, more refined tannins. The grapes were handpicked during the second and third weeks of May with yields of 1 kg per plant. Upon arrival to the cellar, the grapes were carefully selected and de-stemmed before being transferred to the 15,000 liter French oak tanks. The vinification process began with a cold maceration for 5 days, followed by a slow and controlled fermentation at 29°C (84.2°F). The must underwent a total of 30 days of maceration in the 15,000 liter French oak tanks.

WINEMAKER'S NOTES Tierras Moradas 2010 displays a deep and intense color that is almost purple. The nose is elegant, with notes of blackberry, black and pink pepper, cinnamon, clove and spices. On the palate it has pleasant acidity, with great persistence and a wonderful finish. This wine can be enjoyed immediately or aged for 12 to 15 years.
